

QUALITY CONTROL INSPECTION PROGRAM PROHIBITED MATERIALS LIST

SECTION 6.1

Camden Iron & Metal (CIM) and its subsidiaries and affiliates (Receiver) are dedicated to recycling your materials in a safe, efficient and environmentally responsible manner that complies with federal, state and local laws. To this end, we can not accept the following materials:

- Free-flowing liquids associated with scrap (e.g., gasoline, oil, paint, anti-freeze, lubricants, water).
- Non-Metallic Materials (e.g., garbage, wood, concrete, plastic, glass, cardboard, paper, rags, dirt).
- Radioactive Materials of any type (e.g., military scrap, medical scrap).
- Scrap Containing Residue From Hazardous Materials/Wastes such as PCBs, Asbestos, Freon/CFCs, Mercury, Cadmium, Lead or Lead containing materials. Examples of these materials include:
 - PCB-containing ballasts
 - PCB-containing transformers
 - Battery Cables
 - Appliances containing Small PCB Capacitors or Refrigerants
 - Computer monitors, Televisions, and any other product with Cathode Ray Tubes
 - PCB-containing capacitors
 - Automobile Air Bags
 - Mercury Switches
- Explosives of any type.
- Corrosive materials, except batteries when segregated and purchased separately.
- Poisons, Infectious Materials or Chemicals in Solid, Powder, Liquid or Gaseous Form (e.g., medical scrap, fertilizers).
- Pressurized or Closed Containers (e.g., propane tanks, compressed gas tanks, aerosol cans, intact/uncut bulk storage tanks).
- Flammable Materials (e.g., gasoline, kerosene).

In accordance with applicable laws, we enforce our inbound scrap quality program using specialized equipment (i.e., radiation detectors), supplier contracts, and/or careful inspection of incoming scrap loads and vehicles.
